

WARRANT FOR SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

County of Penobscot

To Dennis O'Bar, a Constable in the Town of Corinth in the County of Penobscot:

Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Corinth, in said County qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall on Thursday the 29th (twenty ninth) day of August A.D. 1996 at seven-thirty (7:30) in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles to wit:

Article 1 To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Action: Motion was made by Harold Grant, seconded by Frank Thomas to elect Roger Chesley as moderator. One vote was cast for Roger Chesley and he was declared Moderator to preside at said Meeting.

Roger Chesley appointed Harold Grant, Delwin Blackwell and Steven Foster as Ballot Clerks.

Article 2 To see if the town will vote to adopt the Town of Corinth addressing ordinance to Enhance 9-1-1 service.

Action: Motion was made by Harold Grant, seconded by Steve Foster to adopt the Town of Corinth addressing ordinance to Enhance 9-1-1 service. Motion was carried.

Town of Corinth

Addressing Ordinance

Section 1 Purpose

The purpose of this ordinance is to enhance the easy and rapid location of properties by law enforcement, fire, rescue, and emergency medical services personnel in the Town of Corinth.

Section 2 Authority

This ordinance is adopted pursuant to and consistent with the Municipal Home Rule Powers as provided for in Article VIII, Part 2, Section 1 of the Constitution of the State of Maine and Title 30-A M.R.S.A. Section 3001.

Section 3 Administration

This ordinance shall be administered by the Town of Corinth, which is authorized to and shall assign road names and numbers to all properties, both on existing and proposed roads, in accordance with the criteria in Sections 4 and 5. The Town of Corinth shall also be responsible for maintaining the following official records of this ordinance:

- a. A Corinth map for official use showing road names and numbers.
- b. An alphabetical list of all property owners as identified by current assessment records, by last name, showing the assigned numbers.
- c. An alphabetical list of all roads with property owners listed in order of their assigned numbers.

Section 4 Naming System

All Roads that serve two or more properties shall be named regardless of whether the ownership is public or private. A "road" refers to any highway, road, street, avenue, lane, private way, or similar paved, gravel, or dirt thoroughfare. "Property" refers to any property on which a more or less permanent structure has been erected or could be placed. A

every 50 (fifty) feet to aid in assignment of numbers to structures subsequently constructed.

Section 8. Effective Date

This ordinance shall become effective as of August 29, 1996. It shall be the duty of the Town of Corinth to notify by mail each property owner and the Post Office of a new address at least 30 (thirty) days before the effective date of its use. It shall be the duty of each property owner to comply with this ordinance, including the posting of new property numbers, within 30 (thirty) days following notification. On new structures, numbering will be installed before final inspection or when the structure is first used or occupied, whichever comes first.

Motion was made by Harold Grant, seconded by Steven Foster to adjourn the Special Town Meeting.

Approximately 12 voters was present.

You will give notice that the Registrar of Voters will be at the Town Office, in said Town, during the office hours on Thursday, August 29, 1996 the day of said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
